## RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

### Senate Resolution 61

Senate Resolution 61, introduced by Senator Steele:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the Legislative Council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of the feasibility and necessity of a wilderness preservation system for Indiana's public lands.

*Whereas, The benefits of wilderness areas and their continued maintenance are numerous, as such areas clean our air, filter our water, provide habitats for wildlife, protect watersheds, and are enjoyed by all for their pure aesthetic beauty as well;*

*Whereas, Indiana is comprised of 23,103,300 acres, 394,631 of which are owned by the state of Indiana and 470,000 of which are owned by the United States;*

*Whereas, To protect these public lands and to ensure certain wilderness areas are set aside for future generations to enjoy, a study would be beneficial in determining the need for and the costs, benefits, and impacts of a wilderness preservation system for Indiana's public lands; and*

*Whereas, A study would also be informative in determining all of the options as to how much wilderness should be managed by traditional forestry methods; how much, if any, should be set aside and left to its natural state, free of management; and the desired locations of any such set aside: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the  
General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate urges the Legislative Council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of the need for and the costs, benefits, and impacts of wilderness preservation and fully study the set aside of certain wilderness areas, whether the same is desired by Hoosiers, the pros and cons of any set aside to be left to the natural course of the wooded environment, the amount of any possible set aside, and the various locations of any such set aside.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Legislative Council.

The resolution was read in full and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources.

### Senate Resolution 64

Senate Resolution 64, introduced by Senator Grooms:

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging the legislative council to assign to the appropriate study committee the topic of medication therapy management services provided by pharmacists.

*Whereas, Medication therapy management is an important part of modern drug therapy; and*

**House Concurrent Resolution 54**

House Concurrent Resolution 54, sponsored by Senators Becker and Tomes:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring the Signature School and the nine National Merit Finalists.

*Whereas, Evansville's Signature School was Indiana's first charter high school, founded in 2002;*

*Whereas, Organized through the Signature Learning Center, which later became the Signature School Foundation, Inc., the school is internationally based with emphasis on fine and performing arts, science, technology, mathematics, and the liberal arts;*

*Whereas, True to its mission statement to meet the needs of self-motivated learners in a progressive environment driven by global concerns, the Signature School had nine senior class members who were National Merit Finalists;*

*Whereas, They are Ahmad B. Allaw, Alex S. Brizius, Bowman C. Clark, Matthew A. Davis, Jay R. Erkill, Alexandra B. Hitchcock, Derek M. Kuhnert, Drew R. Samuels, and Sachin Seetharamaiah;*

*Whereas, The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition in which students can earn scholarships and recognition for their accomplishments;*

*Whereas, Any high school student may enter the program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test and by meeting published program entry/participation requirements;*

*Whereas, The Signature School has received numerous awards and recognitions, including being ranked eighth in the nation and number one in the Midwest by the Washington Post, being ranked number seven by Newsweek Magazine, being named a Four Star Award school in 2010, and receiving the Head of the Class Best Buy Award from the Indiana Chamber of Commerce; and*

*Whereas, Academic accomplishments such as this deserve special recognition: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives  
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,  
the Senate concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly congratulates the Signature School and the nine members of the Class of 2014 who were named National Merit Finalists.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to National Merit Finalists Ahmad B. Allaw, Alex S. Brizius, Bowman C.

Clark, Matthew A. Davis, Jay R. Erkill, Alexandra B. Hitchcock, Derek M. Kuhnert, Drew R. Samuels, and Sachin Seetharamaiah, and Jean Hitchcock, Executive Director of the Signature School.

House Concurrent Resolution 55, sponsored by Senator Becker:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION honoring Scott Haffner.

*Whereas, The University of Evansville Athletics Department announced that it retired Scott Haffner's basketball jersey at the men's basketball game against Southern Illinois on Saturday, February 22, 2014;*

*Whereas, Scott Haffner wore jersey number 3 and played at the University of Evansville from 1986 through 1989, scoring 1,686 points in three seasons;*

*Whereas, Scott Haffner scored a program-best 65 points in a 109-83 victory over Dayton at Roberts Stadium;*

*Whereas, Scott Haffner also led the Evansville Aces to their first NCAA Division I Tournament victory in the school's history that same year;*

*Whereas, February 18, 2014, marked the 25th anniversary of that monumental victory over Dayton;*

*Whereas, Haffner was awarded numerous accolades, including Midwestern Collegiate Conference Player of the Year;*

*Whereas, Scott Haffner was selected by the Miami Heat in the second round of the 1989 National Basketball Association draft and later played for Charlotte; and*

*Whereas, Scott Haffner's post-basketball career has been equally successful, working for Eli Lilly and Company as a District Sales Manager, as well as being inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly congratulates Scott Haffner for his life's work and accomplishments.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit copies of this resolution to Scott Haffner and his family.

#### House Concurrent Resolution 56

House Concurrent Resolution 56, sponsored by Senator Wyss:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION recognizing Todd Webster, Tyler Webster, Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza.

*Whereas, Todd Webster, Tyler Webster, Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza traveled a great distance in order to help those in need;*

*Whereas, City Utilities employees Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza along with Todd Webster and Tyler Webster traveled to La Vega, Guatemala, a village of about 900 people with intermittent electricity and only one well to supply clean water;*

*Whereas, The village of La Vega is typical of 51 percent of Guatemala, where the residents live in poverty and where only about 25 percent of water systems disinfect the water they deliver to homes and businesses;*

*Whereas, Before the arrival of the team, La Vega had a year-round well that was hand-dug about 25 or 30 feet and was located only 50 feet from a latrine;*

*Whereas, Living Water International, a religious nonprofit from Houston, researched the project and provided the drill rig, and Todd Webster, Tyler Webster, Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza and others provided the labor;*

*Whereas, The team worked 12 hour days but was repaid many times over by the kindness of the villagers;*

*Whereas, Before long the team was pumping air down the well to clean the drilling water out, sending a spray of water into the streets, and the children into the streets to dance and chant Aqua! Aqua!; and*

*Whereas, These compassionate and loving Hoosiers are shining examples of the people throughout our state: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the Senate concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly thanks Todd Webster, Tyler Webster, Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza for their service to those in need and their willingness to travel far away and live under intense heat and questionable conditions to help a village improve its living conditions.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to Todd Webster, Tyler Webster, Matthew Wirtz, Ben Groeneweg, Mike Kiester, and Ted Nitza and their families.

Senate Resolution 63, introduced by Senator Holdman:

A SENATE RESOLUTION honoring Joseph Hilty for being named a top youth volunteer in the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Prudential Spirit of Community Awards.

*Whereas, Joseph Hilty of Portland, Indiana and a student at East Jay County Middle School, has achieved national recognition for his exemplary volunteer service by being named one of the top youth volunteers in the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Prudential Spirit of Community Awards;*

*Whereas, This prestigious award, presented by Prudential Financial in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals, honors young volunteers across America who have demonstrated an extraordinary commitment to serving their communities;*

*Whereas, Joseph earned this recognition for sending care packages to United States troops as a way to show appreciation for their service;*

*Whereas, After sending his first package, Joseph knew he wanted to do more and set up a lemonade stand to increase awareness and funds, which led to the community helping to raise \$11,000 and more than 300 care packages being sent to men and women in the military; and*

*Whereas, The success of the state of Indiana and the overall vitality of America depend, in great measure, upon the dedication of young people like Joseph who use their considerable talents and resources to serve others: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana Senate honors Joseph Hilty for being named a top youth volunteer in the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Prudential Spirit of Community Awards and thanks him for his service to our troops.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit copies of this Resolution to Joseph Hilty and East Jay County Middle School Principal, M. Lee Newman.

**Senate Concurrent Resolution 46**

Senate Concurrent Resolution 46, introduced by Senator Altig:

*Whereas, On December 6, 1914, the Purdue University Chapter of Delta Upsilon was established by 49 members and has since initiated over 1,600 men;*

*Whereas, Delta Upsilon, the world's only international fraternity devoted to non-secrecy, was founded on four principles: The promotion of friendship, the advancement of justice, the development of character, and the diffusion of liberal culture;*

*Whereas, Since its founding, the chapter's members have a history of being highly involved on campus, leading to the chapter's unofficial motto being, "A Delta Upsilon in everything, and every Delta Upsilon in something;"*

*Whereas, In 2013 alone, the members of the Purdue Chapter accumulated over 1,000 hours of community service and raised over \$2,500 for the Delta Upsilon Global Service Initiative, which is used to serve developing nations; and*

*Whereas, Over its 100-year history, the fraternity has been the home to those who have become war heroes, businessmen, civil servants, engineers, doctors, and scientists and is committed to developing its members over the next 100 years through service, leadership development, and fellowship: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly congratulates the Purdue University Chapter of Delta Upsilon on its 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

SECTION 2. The Secretary of the Senate is hereby directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Purdue University Delta Upsilon Chapter.

Senate Concurrent Resolution 47, introduced by Senators Zakas, Mishler, and Broden:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION congratulating the 2013 Penn High School Indiana Academic Super Bowl State Finalists on their achievements.

*Whereas, The Indiana Academic Super Bowl is a statewide competition sponsored by the Indiana Association of School*

*Principals (IASP) that began in the spring of 1987;*

*Whereas, The goals of the IASP's academic competitions are to showcase Indiana's able scholars, involve their families in the thrill of academic excellence, and provide a rewarding experience for the participant's intellectual performance;*

*Whereas, The Indiana Academic Super Bowl has provided learning beyond the classroom for over 37,000 Indiana students since its inception, and has grown to include over 9,000 Indiana students per year;*

*Whereas, The statewide competition is made up of five subject matter rounds, including English, fine arts, mathematics, science, and social studies, and a sixth interdisciplinary round in which questions cover all five disciplines;*

*Whereas, The State Finals consist of twenty-four state qualifying teams in four classes, competing according to school size, with champions named for each discipline in each class. The topic for the 2013 competition was "The Glory that was Greece";*

*Whereas, The academic teams from Penn High School are a fixture at the State Finals, routinely qualifying teams in multiple disciplines;*

*Whereas, At the 2013 Indiana Academic Super Bowl State Finals, teams from Penn High School placed in the top three within their class in five out of six disciplines, with the social studies team winning their sixth consecutive state title; and*

*Whereas, The Penn High School Indiana Academic Super Bowl teams should be commended for their excellence in academics: Therefore,*

*Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:*

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly congratulates the 2013 Penn High School Indiana Academic Super Bowl State Finalists on their achievements and wishes the Penn High School Indiana Academic Super Bowl teams continued success in all their future endeavors.

#### RESOLUTIONS ON FIRST READING

##### Senate Concurrent Resolution 41

Senate Concurrent Resolution 41, introduced by Senators Bray and Walker:

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION memorializing Billy Frank Hendley.

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley was born May 31, 1938, in Hillsdale, Macon County, Tennessee. He was the eldest son and second child of ten children born to Wilbur J. Hendley, Sr., and Ida May Taylor. Hendley was named jointly for his great uncle William "Billy" Bird Hendley and great grandfather Francis "Frank" M. Hendley, both natives of Putnam County, Tennessee;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley moved with his family to the Bill Douglas Farm just off State Road 252 in Nineveh Township in southern Johnson County, Indiana in July of 1942. There, Hendley began his education, attending several schools during his educational endeavors;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley joined the Indiana Army National Guard as a volunteer on April 29, 1956, where he served three consecutive enlistments from 1956 through 1966. Hendley served as an Ordnance Parts Specialist, Ordnance Supply Specialist, both with Headquarters and Company A of the 738th Ordnance Battalion, and Light Truck Driver with Headquarters and Company B of the 38th Aviation Battalion;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley comes from a family rich in military service, with family members having served for both the Confederacy and Union during the American Civil War;*

*Whereas, In 1962, Billy Frank Hendley had the distinct honor of enrolling in the United States Army Quartermasters School at Fort Lee, Virginia. During his tenure there, Hendley obtained a superior rating and was named an honor graduate from the canvas and webbed equipment repair course;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley spent nine years from 1956 to 1965 working for the Military Department of Indiana in the United States Property and Fiscal Office (USPFO) as a trades helper, junior mechanic, painter, canvas and leather repairman, and automotive repairman. By the end of his tenure with the USPFO, Hendley had advanced to Level 11 (NGW 11-3);*

*Whereas, In addition to his skills as a quartermaster, Billy*

*Frank Hendley was also an excellent marksman, earning the Sharpshooter (Rifle) Badge three times. Hendley was honorably discharged from the Indiana Army National Guard on June 16, 1966, after ten years of service. Hendley attained the rank of sergeant;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley married Marilyn Jo Snyder on November 20, 1959, and of this union were born five children: Bryan D. Hendley, Steven W. Hendley, Timothy H. Hendley, Terri L. Webb, and Carole M. Ellis;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley, with the advice, counsel, and friendship of Mr. F. Edward Vandivier (future two-term mayor of Franklin, Indiana) embarked on his entrepreneurial journey. Hendley began his rewarding and profitable journey of self-employment in 1965. He first owned and managed a Phillips 66 service station and Bill's Upholstery Shop, both in Franklin, Indiana. Hendley eventually closed the service station and later moved the upholstery shop to his home. Hendley's business quickly outgrew his family's home, and he soon bought and relocated the business to an old, abandoned IGA store in the heart of Providence, Indiana. By 1984, Hendley's business had again outgrown its building, and Hendley began leasing a large, two-story building in downtown Bargersville, Indiana. Having built his upholstery business into a thriving, full-time occupation, Hendley decided to quit his "second job" as a truck driver for Roadway Express, Inc. that he had held for eighteen years, from 1966 through 1984. Hendley was always considerate of his family members, making every effort to employ family members in need of work in any way possible in any of his businesses that he was active with at the time of the family member's need;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley held the first Hendley family reunion at his Banta, Johnson County, Indiana home on Memorial Day 1972, and the first national reunion of both branches (clans) of the Hendley family at his farm near Providence, Indiana, on Memorial Day 1975. At this event, The Hendley Family Association of Tennessee was established, and the Association officially came into existence on January 1, 1976;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley played a crucial role in the establishment and success of The Hendley Family Association, serving on the first board of directors of the Association from 1976 to 1977, hosting the first reunion of the Francis Marion Hendley Clan (branch) of the Association, was an honorary signatory of the Association's incorporation charter, and served as the second national president and first native Tennessean of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. of Tennessee from 1978 to 1979. Hendley was also elected to the first board of directors for the Francis Marion Hendley Clan (branch) of The Hendley Family Association, Inc., serving from 2003 to September 23, 2007, when he was again elected to the national board of*

*directors of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. Hendley served in that capacity from his election on September 23, 2007 until his passing on April 20, 2013;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley was presented the President's Award plaque, fashioned in the shape of the State of Tennessee, for his sponsorship of the first three Hendley reunions by the first National President, Francis "Frank" M. Hendley, II of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. on May 31, 1977. He was presented the President's Award of Merit plaque for his dedication to The Hendley Family Association by National President William H. Hendley on May 31, 1982;*

*Whereas, Four of Billy Frank Hendley's children have been involved in the governance of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. Hendley's eldest son, Bryan, is a former member of the board of directors, having served from 1982 to 2001, his eldest daughter, Terri L. Webb, has been serving as national secretary since 1982, his youngest son, Timothy, is a current member of the board of directors, serving since 2001, and his youngest daughter, Carole M. Ellis, has served as assistant national secretary since 1989;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley once rescued two horses from abuse in Brown County, Indiana, adding them to the many other animals he kept on his farm near Providence, Indiana. Hendley sought to instill a sense of responsibility in his children at a young age by having his children care for the horses and many other animals on the family's farm;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley was active in his community and participated in numerous civic organizations, including Eli Lilly American Legion Post #374 of Indianapolis, the Tennessee Monument Commission, Inc., the Confederate High Command re-enactment group, the Indiana-Tennessee Civil War Memorial Commission, the White River Valley Region's Antique Car Club of America, and the Johnson County Association for Retarded Citizens at the Gateway Learning Center in Franklin, Indiana;*

*Whereas, Even after his retirement in 2000, Billy Frank Hendley remained active in his hobbies and in the lives of his children. He continued collecting and restoring classic cars for the antique car club of which he was a member, and at various times helped out his son Timothy, who had taken over the family upholstery business. One project of particular note was a donation of cushions made for the pews at the old World War II P.O.W. chapel museum at the U.S. Army post, Camp Atterbury, in Edinburgh, Indiana in southeast Johnson County. Hendley also began a tradition of housing renovation, which he and his children carried on for twelve years until the time of Hendley's passing;*

*Whereas, Billy Frank Hendley was the recipient of numerous awards and honors for his public service and community*

*involvement, including being appointed an honorary delegate by Congressman William Hill "Bill" Boner and Colonel Aide-de-Camp to Governor Lamar Alexander, being awarded the National Guard Lapel Pin from Indiana Adjutant General Carl G. Farrell, the Honorary Lieutenant Governor Citation from Indiana Lieutenant Governor (and later Governor) Frank O'Bannon, the National Guard Medal by the Department of Indiana American Legion Commander Jim Koutz, the Governor's Outstanding Tennessean Award from Governor Ned R. McWherter, the Cold War Certificate of Recognition from Secretary of Defense Donald Rumsfeld, the Honorary Lieutenant Governor Citation from Indiana Lieutenant Governor (and later Governor) Joseph E. Kernan, and posthumously the National Defense Service Medal by the Indiana Joint Forces Headquarters, Indiana National Guard;*
